Top organist's town recital

An organ recital will be given at St David's Church, Newtown, on March 9, by Timothy Rishton, a prize-winning organist, of Bangor.

The special recital, in aid of the church, will include preludes and a toccata by Bach, works by Karg-Elert and Couperin, some variations on a Norwegian folk song, and a rarely heard concerto by Signor Blamr, a contemporary of Vivaldi.

Mr Rishton, who holds posts at the University of Wales, gives recitals throughout Britain and Northern Europe. He is also organist and choirmaster of the Collegiate Church of Holyhead and the Parish Churches of Holy Island, Anglesey.

He specialises in music of the 17th and 18th centuries and is a recording artist and radio and television broadcaster.

Welsh organist, Timothy Rishton, has a busy weekend ahead of him with concerts at Oswestry and Newtown.

He is at St Oswald's Church, Oswestry, tomorrow and St David's Church, Newtown, on Monday.

The programme for both concerts includes preludes and a toccata by Bach, works by Karg-Elert and Bonnet, some variations on a Norwegian folk song and a little heard concerto by Signor Blamr, who was a contemporary of Vivaldi.

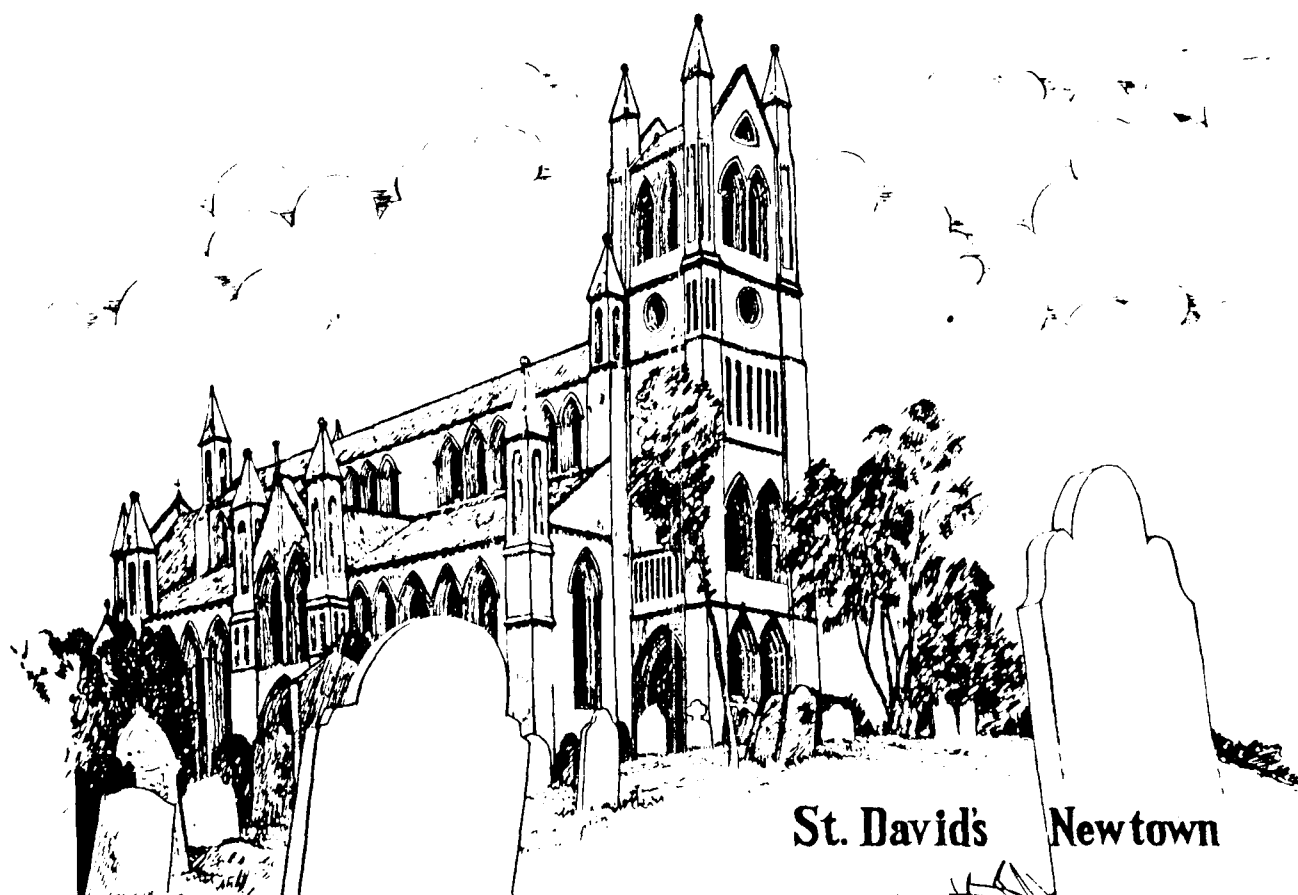
He studied music at the University of Reading, where he won the organ playing prizes each year, and then at the University of Manchester, where he gained a masters degree in music.
